Drought impact on W Cape economy worse than anticipated - minister

Cape Town - Compared to the previous season. aggregate income after costs in the agriculture sector in the Western Cape is estimated to have declined by up to R5.9bn. This is due to the lower output as a result of the drought.

The impact of the drought on the Western Cape economy cannot be sugar coated and is actually higher than previously anticipated, Western Cape minister of economic opportunities Alan Winde said at a media briefing on Thursday.

Treasury could soon be forced to find R3bn to bail out Umgeni Water after an asset management company's threat to withdraw bonds from the state utility.

The threat is contained in a letter to Water and Sanitation Minister Nomvula Mokonyane from lawyers acting for asset manager Futuregrowth, in which it accuses her of destabilising the water board.

Futuregrowth, a division of Old Mutual, acts as an agent to a number of companies that hold bonds issued by Umgeni Water.


The company has sent a copy of the letter to Finance Minister Malusi Gigaba.












/F SA's latest Water File, released at a WWF (World Wildlife Fund) Agricultural ducers' Day near Robertson, said it was estimated that an economic loss of 9billion in agriculture in the Western Cape alone, with a resultant 30 000 job losses exports dropping 13% to 20%, had resulted from the disaster.


Water Stewardship requires you to:

- Look downstream






Stewardship means 'beyond efficiency' & looking after what you don't own




Who stands to lose?
