Presented at the Annual General Meeting held on 10 February 2022

Most of us entered 2021 with optimism and relief that 2020 was behind us and we looked forward to a year where Covid-19 and its restrictions would be forgotten, but alas, this was not to be. Numerous efforts to return to normality were thwarted by new outbreaks and Covid- 19 variants and the usual way of doing things remained elusive. Despite every intention to host one or 2 in-person meetings it soon became evident that the restrictions would remain with us for the foreseeable future.

These limitations taught us to move away from our more traditional way of doing things and required us to take on new skills of hosting webinars, forge new partnerships with webinar hosts, review at our approach to membership, and to be bold in rethinking, and re-imagining our society. Webinars

The traditional August students' event was held on 26 August and was hosted by Dr Thulani Sibanda of the University of Pretoria, where Ursula Thomashoff, Anja Steyn and Jané du Plooy delivered presentations on their research as part of the <u>Probiotic Yoghurt Project</u>.

More "Consumption Moments for Dairy" was the theme of the webinar held on 15 September and presented by Janet Deel-Smith.

Our planned Year-end function coincided with a new wave of Covid-19 restrictions was postponed as a precaution.

Furthermore, our members were also encouraged to participate in Webinars hosted by the Western Cape branch of the SASDT. Our sincere thanks go to all the presenters, sponsors, organizers, webinar hosts and participants for their contribution to the success of these webinars.
