

Rina Belcher (Belnori Boutique Cheesery) and Kobus Mulder received merit awards from the Gauteng and Western Cape and Gauteng branches, at the regions’ 2022 year-end functions.

Rina Belcher is known for producing award-winning goat milk products that combine science and art. Kobus Mulder, South Africa’s ‘King of Cheese’ is a renowned cheese maker and has taught many dairy technologists their craft.
